I. CALL TO ORDER

- 1. The meeting was opened with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.
- 2. The meeting was called to order July 14, 2025, at 8:00 a.m. Chairman Bruce Hoover called roll: Vice-Chairman Pat Liggett, here, Secretary/Treasurer Robert Scott, here. Directors: Gary Burd, here; Steve Cole, here; Richard Kriege, here; Caleb Potter, here. There is a quorum present, and the meeting may proceed. Let the records show that the regular scheduled meeting of Rural Water District #3 Washington County, OK was called to order at 8:00 AM at 17227 N 129th E Ave in Collinsville, Oklahoma. Notice of the meeting was posted on the front door and drive-up window of the district office on July 9, 2025, at 4:00 PM. Also, present Chad Pennington, Field Supervisor; Mike Calhoun, Plant Supervisor, Dona Lewis Recording Secretary, David Dollar, Water PAQ Engineering, Larry Steidley, Steidley Law Office and other interested parties. This meeting will be conducted by the requirements of the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act. Only items on the agenda will be addressed. Anyone wishing to address the board must call the district's office by Wednesday prior to the meeting date and have your name and the nature of your business placed on the agenda.

3. Correction, deletions, or addition to the minutes of:

- **a.** The Regular meeting of June 9, 2025. Steve Cole made the motion to approve the minutes as printed. Richard Kriege seconded. Pat Liggett, yes; Robert Scott, yes; Gary Burd, yes; Caleb Potter, yes. Motion carried unanimously.
- **4. Report of Secretary/Treasurer.** Robert Scott. In July we had 16 new taps and 72 transfers. We sold 18 new taps in June.

- 5. Report of District Manager. Jerry Gammill. The report went out in the packet. The Meadows III, we received plans for review. West Estates, we did reviewed plans for that addition, remember it's on 86th St N and Yale south of the Dollar General. One thing that came through for the Owasso TAC meeting was Braum's located to the south of Reasor's. They have not made any contact with us. I wanted to let you know there was a printout that Andrew-Jayne printed up regarding the Howard Estruct lawsuit. There was an appeal that was made. The attorney fees are going to be on us. They will have hearing to figure out what kind of actual attorney fees. We will have to pay their attorney fees. Project Clydesdale, the county commissioners, tabled it last week and they have another meeting this week. We have been asked to go down and answer questions. We have a lot of people concerned calling and emailing with questions. A gentleman out on Hwy 11 had a high-water bill and was saying the contractor hit his line. He turns us into the Better Business Bureau, and he is asking for a sizable amount of money. The leak happened before the contractor was there on site. The contractor did hit their line, and they fixed it in about 45 minutes. The contractor does owe them some money. I had to draft a response to the BBB and tried to contact them and have not heard back from the BBB. DEQ had called us saying a customer is having a sewer issue and their neighbor is not happy. The customer with the sewer issues called the office and was very upset that we told DEQ what their usage has been. She threatened to contact her attorney. We sent a letter stating we support DEO. We had a contractor out to clear the intake. We had a butterfly valve that broke off about 16ft deep and we have been working on it. Got hit by lightning at the Hogue Tower that caused some damage and even at the plant. You should have a copy of the Capital Improvements plan, and I have no updates on hiring an Assistant Manager. The engineer, still working on it and wanting to talk to Ryan. The project we were going to get Ryan to work on, Kellogg Engineering has put the project on hold. Research on the scanning, I have not had a chance to touch on that at all. The generator, I need to talk to an electrical engineer. We do have one and I need to talk to him about it. The time clock, I believe the ladies are close to deciding. Creating the job description, that has been done. David Dollar, capital improvements, our sodium hypochlorite system is under sized. We went from feeding chlorine gas prior to 2013, to sodium hypochlorite. The information we had at the time was we could feed 4 parts per million of chlorine to 12mgb and that's how it was sized. Last summer our sodium hypochlorite ran continuously. We don't want them to run all the time, maybe 16 hours out of 24. The operators need some down time to do maintenance. Some operational things that need to be addressed.
 - a. Field Manager. Chad Pennington reports 5 field audits, 38 change out meters, 2 replaced can, 0 dirt work, 1 drop-ins, 1 flush line, 0 forfeits, 14 leaks, 2 replaced lid, 0 lower cans, 11 MXU installed to be radio read, 1 checked pressure, 1 raise can, 3 get current readings, 0 radio read, 0 replaced setter, 1 shut off, 33 new taps, 27 miscellaneous, 0 zero usage. 140 work orders completed. We hired a new guy and it's time to start with two crews. I got some prices to buy two new gooseneck trailers, they are Interstate trailers. They will be \$15,150.00 apiece. I need to buy a new 1-ton flat bed. The 1-ton to pull equipment for \$61,383.00. Mike called me and we had a valve broke off. We hired Creek Construction to help dig down to the valve so we could do the repair.

- **b. Office Manager.** Dona Lewis. We issued 203 work orders in June. We will be going live with the utility billing in August. I'm sending flyers out with the July bill letting customers know about our new software is coming soon.
- b. Plant Manager. Mike Calhoun. The river pump and the oxbow pump are still being worked on. AC at the Morrow and the River pump station are out. The MCC building AC's compressor is out. The AC for the chemical building should be in tomorrow. The lightning we had got the VFD on #4 clarifier and ordered I another for \$340.00. The communication between the Hogue and Morrow is now cellular instead of radio. We interviewed a potential operator, and he has a operator C Lab. My guys want me to ask if we put in a carport / extend the building.
- 6. Report of Attorney. Nothing.
- 7. **Report of Engineer.** David Dollar. The developments I worked on are The Cherokee Nation Housing Authority, West Estates, Project Clydesdale, The Meadows III, Foster Creek II, Casey's and AMOCO. We also spent some time on the project at 106th and 129th E Ave. We received plans and they acknowledged our comments. We still need Utility Relocation Agreement, we still need to know what the cost and what the betterment cost will be. We do have more questions. The Owasso project at 96th by by Owasso market, I'm still waiting to hear about the steel casing. The project at Vera, the Washington County waterline relocation project. My last conversation Mr. Kellogg needed to get with Kimley-Horn. The UCMR 5, we completed our review of the third sampling. We are doing four samplings every quarter and there were no PFAS compounds found. Had some requests for atlas map on south end of Collinsville and it is in the Collinsville area. The other one was from Tanner on the east side of Hwy 75 between Hwy and 156th St N. Twenty years ago, the board made decision to start requiring 12-inch on section line roads. I recently helped another water district to prepare a water main sizing policy. ODOT approached the district with a project on Hwy 60. The biggest waterline in the area is a 4-inch and I explained the policy to ODOT. The district can not afford a upgrade. ODOT said not a problem if it's a Resolution you guys passed. That is why we need to do something similar and get it in place.
